

Video: Final Portfolio

Your final video project is to show, in video form, all that you've learned in this class.

Using words, pictures, music, and video, put together a portfolio of what you've done. You don't just have to show off your items, but you can explain with words what you've learned.

The music should be something you've edited somehow. You can make a new edit or mash-up for your music.

Include the Photoshop and Paint pictures you've made, plus clips from videos you've done. You can include text (captions) either made in Photoshop or in the Movie Maker about how you made the projects. Still pictures about the programs you learned are a nice touch.

Your final should be no shorter than three minutes and no longer than five.

WARNING: Animated gifs cannot be imported directly into movie maker. Here's a cheat: Open your animated gif in Photoshop. Select "File" "Export" "Render Video". Make sure you export it as .avi and not as a .mov. THIS MIGHT NOT WORK, but it's worth a try. If your animations don't work, you don't have to include them, but you should include a still image and explain your animation.

Step 1: Get all of your old pictures, sounds, and whatnot gathered together

Step 2: Assemble everything into a video about your work in this class. Make it * **awesome** * and use transitions and effects to make it cool. Think of it as your journey of learning.

Step 3: Add a title and credits. You must also have text in your video, or (if you can swing it) narration. This might not work perfectly, but you can try a [voice-to-text](#) reader, if that's your thing.

Step 4: You will be showing off your video on the last day of the semester.

Step 5: Email your video (backup copy) to Ms. Lowe
